JOHNNIE WALKER



(Melody S64 + J64) Sq. Set 4C. Dance devised by Norman and Helen Robson.

The painting imagines bars 49–56, Grand Chain, danced by the Johnnie Walker image, The Striding Man, partnered with bottles of the Red, Blue, Green, and Black label, and accompanied by the Gold musicians.

Johnnie Walker is a brand of Scotch Whisky owned by Diageo and produced in Kilmarnock, Ayrshire. Introduced in 1820 by John Walker of Kilmarnock, it is the most widely distributed brand of blended Scotch Whisky in the world. In Scotland, a dram (a glass) of whisky welcomes in the New Year.

The first edition of Robert Burns' poems was published in Kilmarnock in 1786. Burns was born on 25th January, 1759; his poems are widely read throughout the world. The last verse of *Scotch Drink*:

*Fortune ! if thou but gie me still
Hale breeks, a scone, an' whisky gill,
An' rowth o' rhyme to rave at will,
Tak a' the rest,
An' deal't about as thy blind skill
Directs thee best.*

A gill of JOHNNIE WALKER for sure!

THE DREAM CATCHER



(Strathspey 96 Sq Set) Dance devisor EILEEN ORR.

A dream catcher is a hand made object based on a willow hoop, on which is woven a loose net or web. The dream catcher is then decorated with personal items; hung above the bed, it is used as a charm to protect sleeping children from nightmares. Only good dreams can filter through and slide down to the sleeper.

The dancers in the painting are all good, and the sleeper is representative of Ethel Caryle, a life long champion of Scottish Country Dancing.

THE DANDELION PICKER

Shown in full bloom the dandelions, before being picked, play host to the bees and butterflies during bars 17–24, diagonal R&L (up/down).

THE TEDDY BEAR'S PICNIC

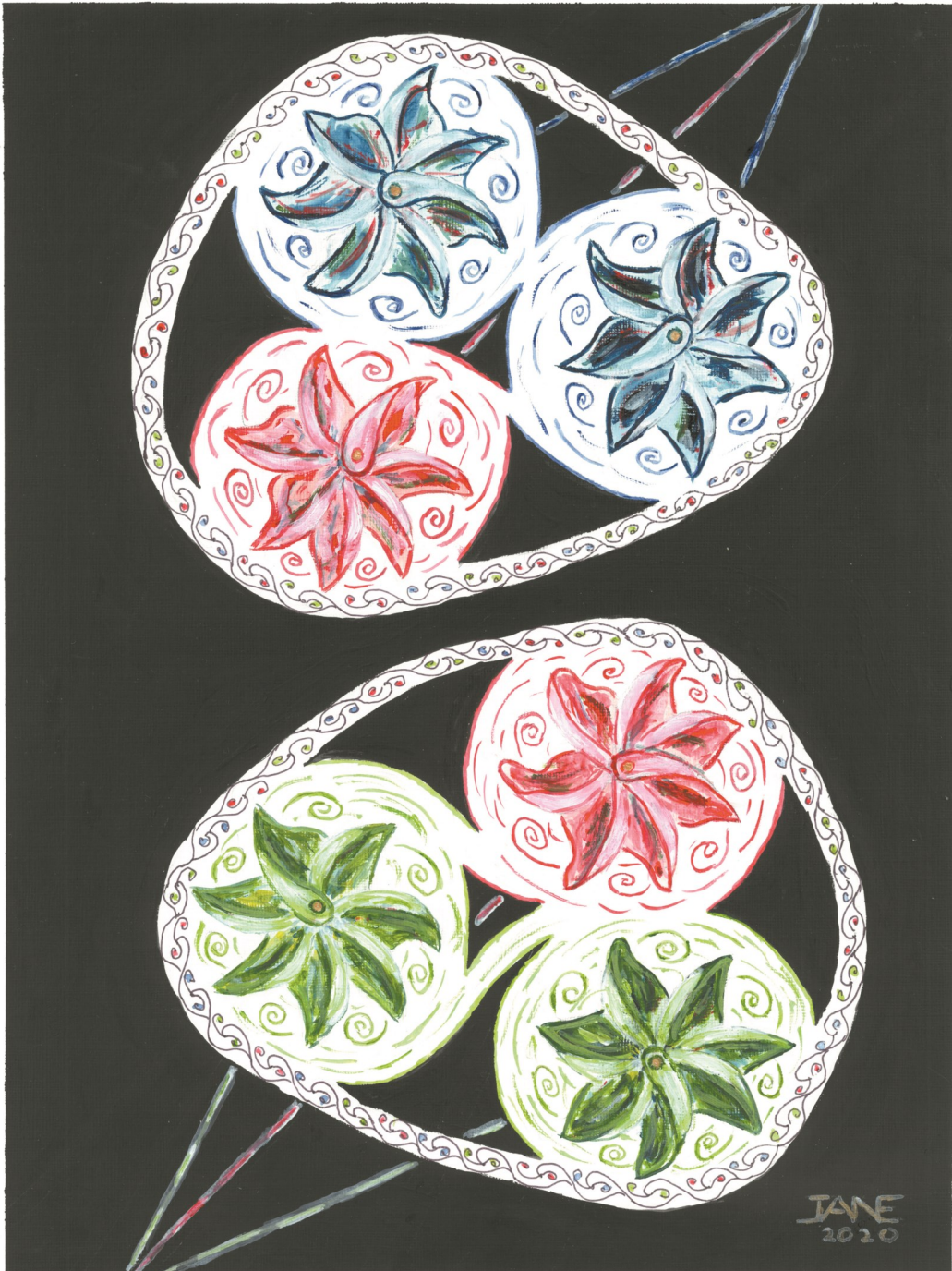

The painting interprets bars 9 -16: 1M dances RH across w 3s while 1L dances RH across w 2s.

2. A child's toy, especially the windmills made from paper and pinned to a stick.

HALLO HALLOWE'EN

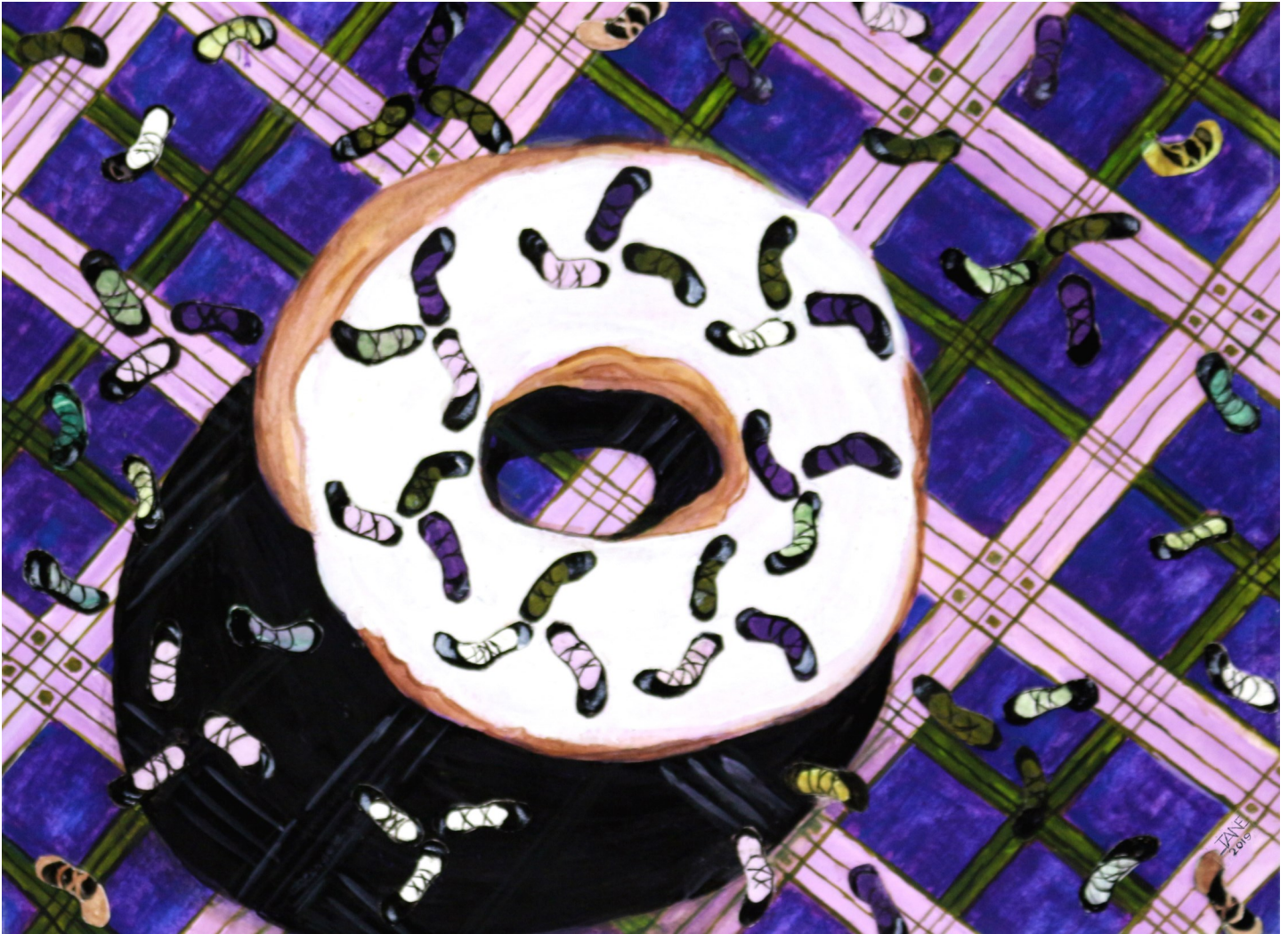
